Abstract Guidelines:

- Philosophical abstracts should clearly state the issue being addressed and provide a summary of the arguments and a conclusion.
- Research and policy-based abstracts should contain a project description an approach or methods and findings/results.
- Abstracts describing practical applications of theoretical knowledge should describe the project aims, implementation and where available report the evaluation.

### Submission Details:

- Abstracts should be submitted on the Abstract Submission form.
- Deadline for abstract submission is Friday July 30, 2010
- Abstracts will be accepted for both poster and oral presentation. Please indicate clearly whether you would like your abstract to be considered for an oral presentation, a poster presentation, or both, on the attached abstract submission form.
- Oral presentations will occur during concurrent sessions. Speakers will have 20 minutes maximum presentation time followed by 5 minutes for questions from the floor.
- Poster presenters will be expected to attend the conference and to stand with the poster during the morning and afternoon poster viewing times.
- The payment of the conference registration fee, travel and accommodation will be the responsibility of those submitting the abstract.
- Abstracts should contain a title, followed by the names and designations of all contributing authors and the contact details of the corresponding author
- Abstracts are to be a maximum of 300 words in length
- Abstracts are to be single-spaced, in 'Times New Roman' 12 point typeface

Successful applicants will be notified by 30th August 2010. With acceptance by presenters to be finalised by 1<sup>st</sup> September 2010
