AN ENVIRONMENT WHERE EVERY MINUTE MATTERS

St. Paul's Hospital hosts over ten thousand surgical procedures annually, and provides crucial surgical training for emerging physicians, nurses and operating theatre staff during these procedures. Our Hospital manages Saskatchewan's surgical transplant program and is the only provincial site where kidney transplants are performed. We have the only dedicated thoracic surgery program in Saskatchewan.

INTEGRATED SUITES - A FIRST FOR SASKATOON HOSPITALS!

Advanced lighting technology with integrated cameras, large monitors and the capacity for connectivity will replace St. Paul's Hospital's current twenty-five year old single bulb system. Changes to the surgical work environment will reduce clutter, improve turnaround time between surgeries, and provide increased ergonomic comforts reducing surgical team fatigue. Crucial patient Information - such as test results, patient history and diagnostic images - will be readily available and easily viewed during the actual surgical procedure. New technologies bring the capacity for global connectivity, resulting in improved acute-care education and training, and connectivity for surgical team consultation with off-site professionals through secure channels.

The future of surgical health care is technology

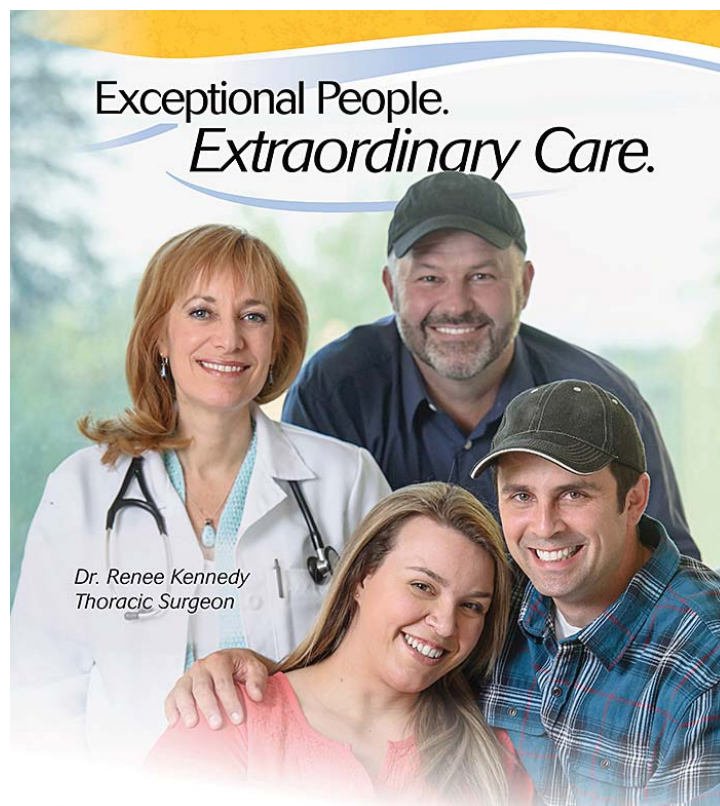
