Executive Committee Meeting - June 15, 2020

Meeting was called to order @10:30 AM

A meeting of the Executive Committee of the Alumni was held to discuss Alumni activities during the COVID 19 pandemic. The auditor's report was shared, with all accounting practices approved. Diane Neufeld moved, seconded by Sharon McCallion, that B. Shebelski be appointed as auditor for 2021. Carried.

Other Business:

For 1 year only the donation of \$5000.00 will be extended to St. Paul's Foundation. The original motion was voted on in Dec. 2016. The areas of highest need are Critical Care Monitor, the Hospice and Continuing Education.

Diane Hergott moved, seconded by Sharon McCallion, that the funds be put towards the Critical care monitor. Carried.

All motions to be voted on at the next possible General Meeting, for discussion and a vote.

Committees and Members are encouraged to keep in touch with each other and the Executive.

This portion of the meeting was adjourned @11:30 AM. The financial committee meeting followed.

Hospice at Glengarda

The Hospice at Glengarda has finally opened to take patients! The opening occurred in January, 2021. This beautiful facility will give people near death a place of solace to spend the remainder of their days. It is considered a "freestanding" facility because it is not attached to another facility (healthcare or otherwise). It offers a homelike environment to the broadest possible population. It lets patients be close to both family and medical care. The Hospice is meant for those patients in their final 30 days of life that have medical needs that cannot be met at home.

It was built on the site of the former Ursuline Sister's Residence. The founder of this Order was Angela Merici whose home was at Lake Glengarda in Northern Italy. This site is on Treaty Six territory which is the traditional homeland of the Metis in Saskatchewan.


The hospice is a 15-bed residential facility and is a first for the community of Saskatoon. It is located at 301 Hilliard Street in a quiet residential area, near a church and mature park setting. It will provide a nurturing, welcoming and comforting environment for end of life care. The rooms are spacious, comfortable and filled with light. There are fireplaces in each room, bathroom facilities and TV's. There are also community spaces including kitchens, coffee nooks, dining rooms and welcoming hearths. There is easy access to outdoors with garden areas on each floor.

St. Paul's Foundation started the "Close to Home Campaign" to assist with the financing of the facility. It has been wildly successful, raising more than \$20 million towards the completion of the Hospice.

Two significant donations came from two of our nurses! One was made by the family of Betty Porter (Puype '64) to honour her life that was dedicated to her family, her community and her work.

The other was made by Maxine MacSymetz (McConnell '63). She is dedicating her gift to honour the three sons that predeceased her, Kevin, Blair and Mark McSymetz.

The generosity of all to the Close to Home Campaign will have a deep and lasting impact on our community for generations to come!

Lola Holmes (Pearsall '43) was named as the "world's oldest curler". She is currently 102, and residing in Vancouver. She curled her last game in March 2020, and stopped curling due to Covid-19 restrictions!
