Reflecting on Achievements of 2012

This spring, SPH Foundation will celebrate several significant donations in support of our digital transmission electron microscope fund raising initiative. Our goal was to raise \$1.4 million to purchase and install Saskatchewan's only digital electron microscope at St. Paul's Hospital. I am pleased to report that we have received tremendous support from donors in Saskatoon and across Saskatchewan. The Saskatoon Health Region has now selected the microscope manufacturer and installation is expected to be complete by June of 2013. We look forward to celebrating the grand opening with our donors later this year.

I would like to look back for a moment on 2012. The year was punctuated by a number of wonderful achievements. SPH completed renovations of the Rawlco Radio Surgical Unit and the Leslie and Irene Dubé Urology Centre of Health Ambulatory Unit. These two achievements fulfilled our commitments to *Embracing the Future* campaign donors. We will officially celebrate the grand opening of the Dubé Urology Centre of Health Ambulatory Unit later this spring.

Raising the money for building Saskatoon's first palliative care hospice continues to be a priority for SPH Foundation. The Saskatoon Health Region and St. Paul's Hospital are currently consulting with community stakeholders, creating the model of care and developing the plan for this hospice. It is SPH Foundation's hope that we will receive approval to begin our hospice fund raising in 2013. We know Saskatoon and area residents would benefit immensely from a palliative care hospice.

Donors and volunteers are the lifeblood of SPH Foundation. Any success we enjoy is due entirely to your commitment to St. Paul's Hospital. Thank you from the bottom of my heart for everything you contribute.


THE GREAT REVEAL

Diagnostic Tools for Superior Imaging

Whether a patient arrives at St. Paul's Diagnostic Imaging Unit seeking to have their disease revealed, diagnosed, or examined, often the same emotions are involved – eagerness to get in for testing, and then anxiety, waiting on results. Reduced wait times; superior imaging capability; increased physician confidence in diagnosis: all are critical elements when potentially life-altering patient information hangs in the balance.

In solving the mysteries that our health can often pose, Diagnostic Imaging and Nuclear Medicine plays a key role in the utilization of technology by providing detailed images of our internal parts which when analysed can help identify any underlying medical condition and advance a treatment plan.

St. Paul's Diagnostic Imaging department houses suites for the MRI, CT, Angiography and Nuclear Medicine – all equipment and techniques that can create pictures of the structures and activities inside your body to assist in the investigative process. Open 24 hours, seven days a week, the demand for imaging services offered at St. Paul's continues to rise, serving patients from across the Saskatoon Health Region.



A graduate of the U of S College of Medicine, Dr. Chris Wall completed his fellowship in Australia, returning to Saskatoon and St. Paul's Hospital in 2009. One of three full-time radiologists at St. Paul's, he shares his time between performing procedures in the Angio Suite, and interpreting MRI and CT imagery.

"Our Angio Suite allows Interventional Radiologists to perform minimally invasive procedures using real-time x-ray guidelines," says Dr. Wall. "St. Paul's Angiography Suite is now one of the best in Canada." "We continue to investigate opportunities to ensure patients have access here in Saskatoon to sophisticated technologies that are able to provide the most accurate and essential information for diagnosis and treatment that is standard for health care in the 21st century."

In 2013 St. Paul's Hospital Foundation is raising funds to acquire the best molecular imaging equipment available in Canada – for right here at SPH – providing physicians and surgeons with a superior form of diagnostic tool to ensure patients timely, accurate and definitive diagnosis of their condition.

A first for the Saskatoon Health Region, this \$2.3 million project (equipment and renovation) will house molecular imaging equipment (SPECT-CT), that combines the best of a gamma camera and a CT into one device, enabling visual certainty and detail in identifying location while simultaneously assessing how things are functioning internally. This equipment provides proven advantages for those suffering from diabetes, cancers (including bone, breast, prostate and thyroid) and brain, nasal and oral tumours, along with superior benefits in infection imaging.

"We see equipment like SPECT-CT as an integral part of the molecular imaging toolbox, helping us in the discovery process and serving as a valuable key to improved patient management." Dr. Edward Lee BSc, MD CM, MBA, Radiologist, Nuclear Medicine Physician, SHR

Besides visual art, activities also include poetry, written word and musical performances (a music therapist was added in 2012) both in various gathering areas on patient floors and also one-on-one.

The SPH Healing Arts Program works on building positive collaborative partnerships with community organizations with special focus on at-risk youth in the vicinity of St. Paul's Hospital. Youth come to participate at SPH to paint and connect with patients and caregivers. This partnership allows for youth in our core neighbourhood to feel a connection to SPH, to build personal selfesteem and to actively participate in building community safety, ownership and respect for all.

LEAVING A LEGACY



BFTTY AUCKLAND

Described by friends as "a proper English woman", Betty Auckland was raised in urban England then brought to Saskatchewan as a war bride after WWII. The young teacher settled with her husband, Charlie, in Gledhow, south of Saskatoon. Upon her arrival in the midst of a prairie winter and having to cope without many of the basic amenities including electricity, Canada and specifically Saskatchewan, at first must have seemed very primitive indeed for this young lady.

However, eventually there were fond memories, many of those including the camaraderie of her friend from England; who married her husband's brother Alex; and also chose to settle in Saskatchewan. Social activities high on the list included dancing, and Betty and Charlie were eager to participate in local activities, soon becoming skilled square dancers.

After farming for many years in Saskatchewan, the Aucklands gave up the cold Saskatchewan winters for the warmth of Arizona. Charlie's lengthy illness precipitated a move to The Franklin in Saskatoon for their retirement years.

Betty passed away at St. Paul's Hospital in January 2012 at the age of 92. Her estate reflected her generosity and concern for health care in our community and beyond, leaving an extraordinary gift of \$100,000 to support St. Paul's Hospital's greatest areas of need.

St. Paul's Hospital Foundation is humbled and most appreciative of the legacy Betty Auckland has provided, which is certain to make a difference in the lives of many patients and their families across Saskatchewan.



COURTNEY MILNE

A new wall mural was installed in 2012 adjacent to St. Paul's Tim Hortons seating area. The 13 by 6 foot reproduction of well-known local photographer Courtney Milne's photograph entitled "Harmony" is sure to provide calm and inspiration to families, patients and staff at St. Paul's Hospital.

Courtney Milne passed away in 2010. He was not only a master photographer – he was also an artist, author, educator, keynote speaker, and philanthropist. His career took him on global journeys that spanned all seven continents. He published 12 books of photography; including The Sacred Earth, which carries a foreword by His Holiness, The Dalai Lama. Milne's multi-media shows have attracted audiences worldwide, and his photographs have been shown in more than 200 exhibitions. Courtney Milne's widow, Sherrill Miller, generously agreed to donate the reproduction costs associated with the use of one of Courtney's images, used in this grand scale at St. Paul's.

The pool of water and surrounding tree in the image had great impact on Courtney. In his commentary on the photographs in his Pool of Possibilities e-calendar, he remarks that "Today the pool offers a safe haven, a place to be more closely connected to nature, a site where I can be in accord with all that surrounds me."

"Courtney always hoped his images would be inspiring and healing to others, so I know he would be thrilled to see 'Harmony' in such splendour in the hospital foyer," says Sherrill Miller.

RAWLCO RADIO SURGICAL UNIT GRAND OPENING

A major goal of St. Paul's Hospital Foundation *Embracing the Future* campaign was to establish the Leslie and Irene Dubé Urology Centre of Health at St. Paul's Hospital, promising the best detection and treatment options available for an increasing number of patients from Saskatoon and across Saskatchewan with prostate cancer and other urological diseases.

September 12, 2012, an event was held at St. Paul's to celebrate the opening of a state-of-the-art 18-bed surgical unit serving as an essential component of the Leslie and Irene Dubé Urology Centre of Health. Many special guests were in attendance including Leslie and Irene Dubé, Rawlco Radio representatives and other donors whose great levels of generosity are recognized with room and area naming within the unit.

The \$6.5 million renovation and construction project was funded through the Saskatchewan government with \$1.8 million in support from St. Paul's Hospital Foundation's *Embracing the Future* campaign including \$1 million from Gordon and Doug Rawlinson and Rawlco radio.

Surgery 4B was officially named the Rawlco Radio Surgical Unit, in

recognition of the extraordinary support granted St. Paul's Hospital by the Rawlinsons and Rawlco Radio to help meet the goals of the SPH Foundation's campaign and support the vision of the Leslie and Irene Dubé Urology Centre of Health.

The new 18-bed Rawlco Radio Surgical Unit puts patients first by supporting faster access to surgical services. The unit will increase capacity at St. Paul's Hospital for additional urology, plastics and ear, nose and throat in-patient surgery. These extra surgical recovery beds will get the Region much closer to its goal of providing all surgeries within three months by 2014.

The new unit design is based upon current standards for infection control and safety and includes all single-patient rooms with wheelchair-accessible washrooms and patient lifts in each room as well as a negative pressure room. There are also three modular nursing stations, isolation capacity and advanced technology to



support patient safety and improved communication processes. Patients treated post-prostate and other urological surgeries will be cared for on this unit.

The second component of the Leslie and Irene Dubé Urology Centre of Health – the main floor ambulatory care unit – just completed in January 2013, offers additional patient resources, consult rooms, research area and exam rooms, to better serve patients and families facing these difficult health challenges.

Thank you to everyone who has supported the Urology Centre of Health, ensuring that St. Paul's continues to best meet the health care needs of our community and beyond.

Volunteer Joe LaPointe

He grew up in the neighbourhood, attended St. Mary's school; and as a 15-year-old boy, spent two weeks in St. Paul's Hospital with a broken leg resulting from a football game. This was Joe LaPointe's first real introduction to St. Paul's, and he still fondly recalls how the nurses went above and beyond to ensure he received compassionate care.

Joe joined St. Paul's Hospital Foundation Board in the early 1980's, serving two terms. Following his resignation from the Board, Joe began routinely volunteering, committing two hours each week to visiting patients on the fifth, sixth and seventh floors at St. Paul's. "I didn't care who they were," Joe says. "We are all human, and if they were confined to a hospital bed, I wanted to be able to offer them someone to talk to – if they wished."

In November 2012, Joe was honoured at Saskatoon's National Philanthropy Day event, recognized for his generous volunteer support of St. Paul's Hospital. In addition to the aforementioned he has chaired the SPHF Planned Giving Advisory Committee, participated on the Embracing the Future campaign's Steering Committee, founded the **Driving Fore Prostate Charity Golf** Classic; and participated in several other fundraising initiatives. A very humble man, Joe LaPointe was reticent at acknowledging the recognition, stating that, "This isn't all about me; it's about all the volunteers out there who are not recognized."

We thank Joe LaPointe for making a difference in so many lives through his volunteer efforts at St. Paul's Hospital and with SPH Foundation.

Thank you Henry Remai, for supporting St. Paul's Hospital and thereby ensuring that the legacy of excellence in compassionate care continues for our community and beyond.






