TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE

St. Paul's High Volume Lab

For many patients, diagnosis begins in the lab. "Eighty percent of patient diagnoses are connected to laboratory testing," says Lenore Howey, manager of the High Volume Laboratory (HV Lab) at St. Paul's Hospital. On any given day, as many as 4,200 specimens pass through the HV Lab, each one representing a patient who is waiting for the results. "It's very high volume," says Lenore. "Quality is vital for the end result."

For that reason, the Saskatoon Health Region, under Lenore's leadership, has undertaken a "Lean" analysis of the HV Laboratory to identify time-wasting activities and streamline the processes so everything runs as smoothly and as timely as possible. "We monitor turnaround time 24/7 for acute care patients," she says. "We're very diligent in tracking that time on a daily basis and if there are any outliers, we review them every day to understand how we can do better." In the lab, specimen racks are colour-coded: red for acute care patients (in hospital), green for specimens referred from outside the hospital (community and rural)

and blue for storage when testing is complete. Red specimens always take priority.

"One of our challenges is that we don't see our patients directly in the lab. They come to us in specimen bottles. Our focus is to remember they are someone's grandmother or someone's son," says Lenore,

who oversees a staff of about 85 lab technologists, lab assistants and phlebotomists (those who take blood). "Our greatest asset is the wonderful staff I work with each day. They are professionals dedicated to the highest level of patient care and service."

TRANSMISSION ELECTRON MICROSCOPE

Preparations Underway

Thank you to everyone who supported our \$1.4 million "Seeing Is Believing" fundraising drive to purchase an advanced Transmission Electron Microscope (TEM) for St. Paul's Hospital. The TEM is on order and, meanwhile, renovations are underway to create a state-of-the-art TEM lab at St. Paul's. It will be the first of its kind in Saskatchewan and will serve patients across the province. TEM is essential

in the diagnosis of kidney disease and other conditions that require extreme magnification of the cell structure. "With the new digital electron microscope, the turnaround time for a diagnosis will be much quicker - three to five days," says TEM Technologist Karen Slattery. "It will greatly benefit patient care, teaching and research. The people of Saskatchewan are very fortunate to have this technology here."



SPIRIT OF LIFE

Harold Bronson



When Harold Bronson passed away in July 2012 at the age of 94, he left a lasting legacy to his community – a \$100,000 bequest to St. Paul's Hospital Foundation. "We did not know that Mr. Bronson had included St. Paul's Hospital in his will, so it

was a wonderful surprise to receive this generous gift," says Bruce Acton, CEO of St. Paul's Hospital Foundation.

A farm boy from Alberta, Harold studied at the University of Saskatchewan, completing a PhD in 1965 and settling into life as a professor of political science and economics. He was fascinated by grassroots politics here and abroad, supporting farmer initiatives and travelling to Cuba, Jamaica, China and Russia to observe the political and economic conditions. He published several books and, for twenty years until 2004, produced the Canadian sovereignty newspaper "Independence News."

As a young man, Harold joined the air force and served as a navigator aboard Lancaster bombers operating in Europe during the Second World War. He was proud of his contribution to the fight against Hitler and Nazism. His devoted wife,

Edith, passed away in 1994 and, for his last six years, he lived in the Veterans Village at the Sherbrooke Community Centre in Saskatoon.

"Harold Bronson was very authentic person, a man whose vision of his life, and for others, was to dream," says his nephew Neil Falkeid. "His belief that a sense of humor, the willingness to be open and desiring to learn, the need for human equity and dignity, and the importance of community stand as a legacy for Uncle Hal."
