Hello Alumni! We are embarking on a new year, and hoping that this year holds some positives for all the members of our association!

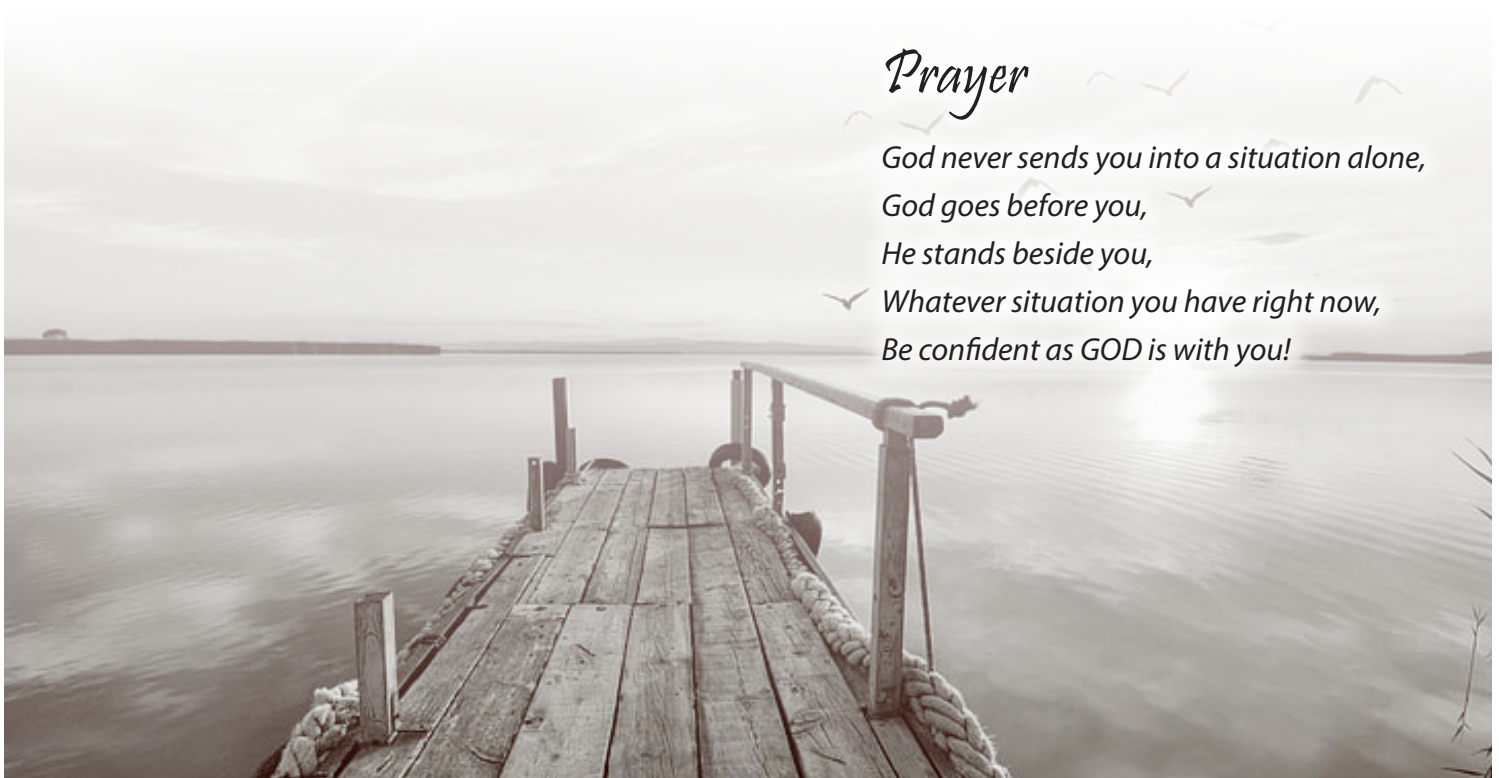

# Greetings from the Executive

We hope you have had a peaceful, family and friend filled holiday season. Activities of the Alumni are carrying on as much as possible during these times. Aging and health challenges, both of ourselves and our families, bring our thoughts to bear on the future of the Alumni.

With that in mind at our AGM we presented information and an outline for the future.

## General Information:

3 year average income from memberships (about 200)	\$4000.00
3 year average expenses: for newsletter, card and flowers	\$1730.00
Scholarships/donations	\$9000.00
Expenses with donations/scholarships	\$10730.00

## Next Steps for Alumni Association:

1. Broad consensus from members is to continue social activities as long as possible and gradually reduce extraneous activities (from Questionnaire).
2. Newsletter is the most important method of keeping all members in touch.
3. Both donations and scholarships unsustainable at this rate.

## Recommendations: 2 Year Plan

1. Reduce General Meetings to 2 per year - May (spring) and December.
2. Keep membership rates for 2022-2023 at \$20.00.
3. Set scholarships for 2022 at \$2000.00.
4. Set donation to SPH for 2022 at \$2000.00.
5. Set Archives' budget to assist in organizing and decisions for future of Archives \$2000.00.
6. Set scholarships for 2023 at \$1500.00.
7. Set donation to SPH Foundation for 2023 at \$1500.00.
8. Draw down Reunion investment by only reinvesting \$8000.00 and adding interest and \$2000.00 of capital to chequing account.
9. Suggest a Financial Review every 2 years.

Moved by Joyce Lenz, seconded by Cecile Diebert (LePage '58) that the recommendations be accepted. Carried by a show of hands.

The Executive met in September and again in November to provide support and committee guidance.

A sincere thank you to all committees for keeping us organized and moving forward.

Thank you also to members who keep us in the know with notes and messages included in the memberships. If you have any suggestions for what you would like to see from the Alumni going forward please let us know.

The Christmas Luncheon at the WDM was enjoyed by 33 members, sharing in the meal and fellowship.

Please remember we no longer accept capes. If you are giving away your cape, please remove the SPH crest first.

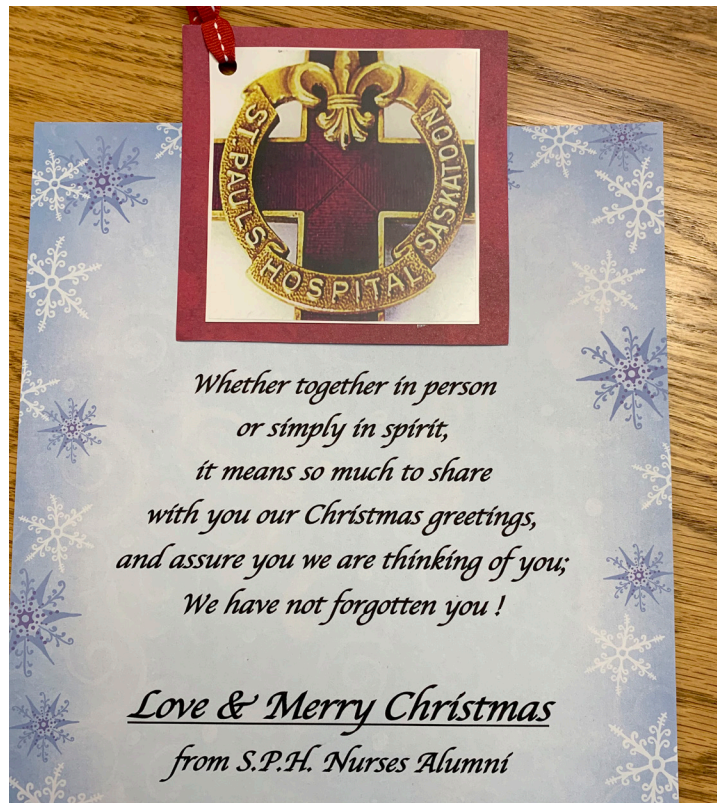

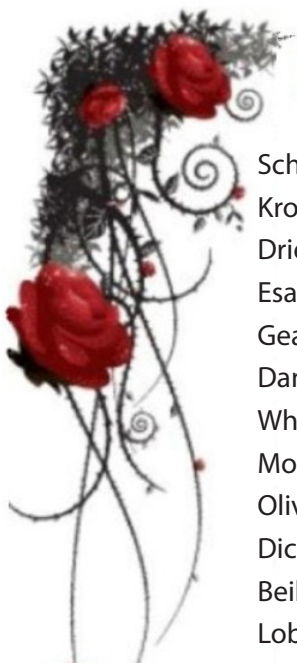

This story was submitted to the  
"Looking Back 100 Years"  
by an Alumnus about an incident that  
happened when she was a student.

A routine medical "treat" that was used  
on the second floor was the castor oil  
cocktail (orange juice, castor oil, and  
baking soda).

My first encounter with this treat  
happened on a day shift. I diligently  
mixed the cocktail and delivered it  
to the ward for 4 elderly ladies. Two  
of these ladies spoke only Ukrainian.

I went up to a lady in bed one ,  
completely mangled the name of the person who was to get the cocktail, and she said "Ya,Ya". A lengthy explanation  
followed and she finally swallowed the mixture. As I am leaving the room, the lady in bed 2 says "Yes, I am Mrs. ...., did  
you need me?"

As I was only a second year student I was now having a panic attack! My first accident slip was now imminent. With my  
whole body shaking, I reported the med error to my supervisor. She asked who the doctor of the patient was and I told  
her it was Dr. Herman, to which she replied "He's right here, tell him yourself." I didn't know Dr. Herman but I certainly knew  
his reputation for being very diligent about those in his care. His patients were mostly heart patients, and of course that  
patient was a heart patient. I had been told his temper was something you never wanted to witness, and I had to tell him  
about my med error!

Gathering every inch of courage I had, I made the report to him. His reply was "You needn't worry so much! She will only  
have a bowel movement." He then wrote out an order for the cocktail I had given her and no accident slip was needed!  
That day I learned to be very careful about what to believe when told the reputation of certain doctors. Needless to say, he  
always remembered my name after that incident, and this student nurse had gained his respect for being truthful.
